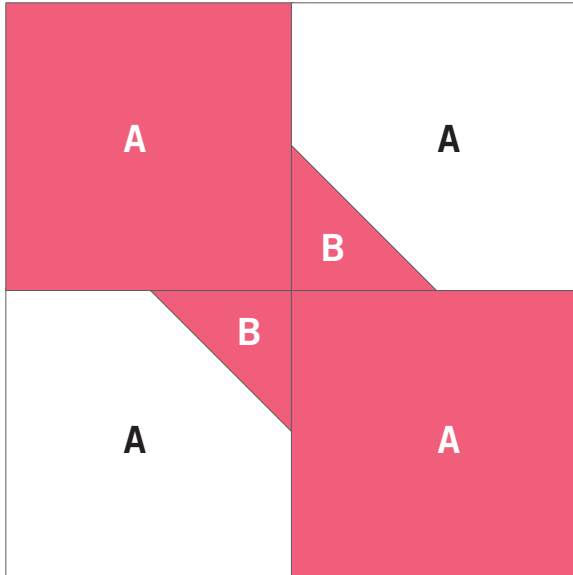




GO! Bowties-4" Finished by Alex Anderson

Fabric Cutting Tips for a 2-color, 4" finished Bowties block:

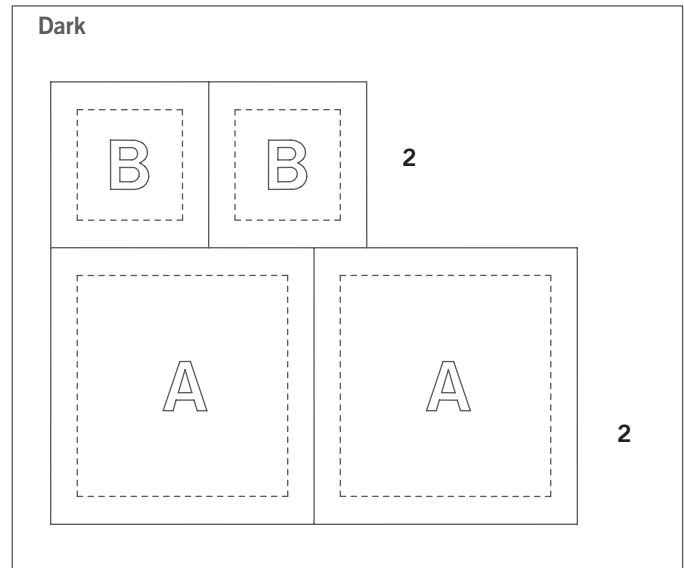
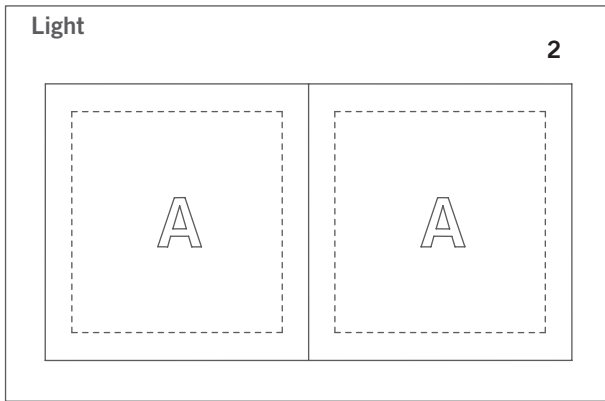


Place fabric over shapes then run through the cutter:

For best cutting results, position fabric on the lengthwise grain (straight of grain) as it goes under the roller.

- **2½" Squares:** Cut a 10½" strip across the width of fabric. Fanfold into 3" widths. Place on selected blade and cut. Cut 52 squares across the width of fabric. One yard of 40" wide fabric cuts 156 squares.
- **1½" Squares:** Cut a 3½" strip across the width of fabric. Fanfold into 2" widths. Place on selected blade and cut. Cut 40 squares across the width of fabric. One yard of 40" wide fabric cuts 400 squares.

Shapes needed for 4" finished Bowties



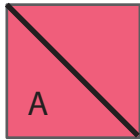

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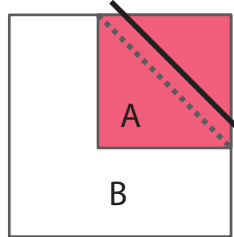
How to Sew the Bowties Quilt Block:

Step 1



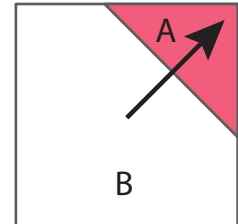
Draw a diagonal line, corner to corner, on wrong side of two, Fabric #1, 1½" A squares.

Step 2



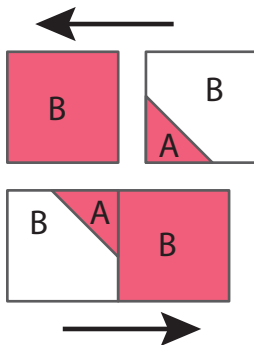
Place marked A square, right sides together, with corner of Fabric #2, 2½" B square. Sew directly on marked line. Trim seam allowance to ¼".

Step 3



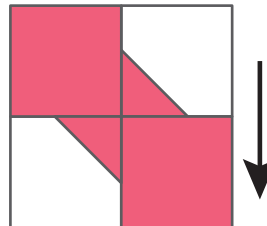
Press seams toward corner. Make two matching A/B units.

Step 4



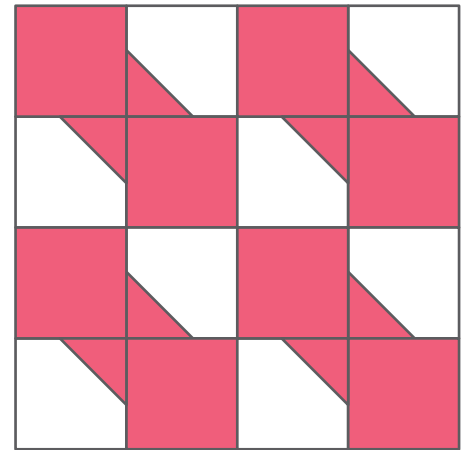
Lay out A/B units from previous step and two Fabric #1, 2½" B squares as shown. Sew A/B units and B squares together in pairs. Press seams in opposite directions.

Step 5



Sew pairs together to complete Bowtie unit.

Step 6



Sew four Bowtie units together to complete 8" x 8" finished Bowtie Block.
