



### Fabric Cutting Tips for one 11" finished Joseph's Coat block (up to 13 colors:




#### Place fabric over shapes then run through the cutter:


For best cutting results, position fabric on the lengthwise grain (straight of grain) as it goes under the roller. Tip: The die is specially designed to cut one complete 11" finished block (up to 13 colors) in two passes through the cutter.

#### Follow instructions for each pass:

- Fabric Color 1 (white/background): Cut three  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $5\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles. Place right side up over shape A to cut three shapes.
- Fabric Color 2 (select 1-6 colors): Cut six  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles. Place right side up over shape B to cut six shapes of the same color or a variety of colors.

Shapes needed for 11" finished Joseph's Coat








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
#### How to Sew the 11" finished (up to 13 colors) Joseph's Coat Block:


The How to Sew instructions show you how to assemble the 11" finished block. Use a consistent 1/4" seam allowance and stretch or ease fabrics as needed to ensure a smooth seam. Press seams as directed in your pattern.



Sew A shape to B shape. Hint: Lay A concave shape on top of B convex shape, right sides together, match up notches and pin. Line up the tip of the A shape dog ear with the corner opposite the seam you will be sewing.

Make 6 A/B units.





Sew a B shape onto the outside of each A shape as shown to complete the block.
