


Half Square-3" Finished Triangle Quilt Block E (55009) Use 5" × 10" Mat (55110)

finished block

Scraps of white, pink, and orange prints

From white print, cut: 6—Block E (3") triangles

From pink print, cut: 6—Block E (3") triangles

From orange print, cut: 6—Block E (3") triangles

assemble block

- 1. Sew together a white print triangle and a pink print triangle to make a pink trianglesquare (Diagram 1). Press seam toward pink print triangle. Repeat to make three pink triangle-squares total.
- 2. Join a white print triangle and an orange print triangle to make an orange trianglesquare (Diagram 2). Press seam toward orange print triangle. Repeat to make three orange triangle-squares total.
- **3.** Sew together a pink print triangle and an orange print triangle to make a pink-andorange triangle-square (Diagram 3). Press seam toward orange print triangle. Repeat to make three pink-and-orange trianglesquares total.
- **4.** Lay out triangle-squares in three horizontal rows (Diagram 4). Sew together squares in each row. Press seams in one direction. alternating direction with each row. Then join rows to make a block (Photo). Press seams in one direction.



By using AccuQuilt® GO!™ you can save about 8 hours cutting a double-bed-size quilt! If you want to hand-cut the shapes, cut:

From each white print, pink print, and orange print: 3-31/8" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 6 triangles of each print (18 triangles total)

From blue print, cut:

- 1—Block C (6½") large triangle
- 5—Block E (3") small triangles

From yellow print, cut:

- 1—Block C (6½") large triangle
- 5—Block E (3") small triangles

assemble block

- 1. Sew together a blue print small triangle and a yellow print small triangle to make a small triangle-square (Diagram 1). Press seam toward blue print triangle. Repeat to make five small triangle-squares total.
- 2. Sew together a blue print large triangle and a yellow print large triangle to make a large triangle-square (Diagram 2). Press seam toward blue print triangle.
- 3. Sew together two small triangle-squares to make a pair (Diagram 3). Press seam in one direction. Add pair to one edge of large triangle-square. Press seam toward large triangle-square. Then join three small triangle-squares to make a row. Press seams in one direction. Join row to large triangle-square to make a block (Photo). Press seam in one direction.





By using AccuQuilt® GO!™ you can save about 5 hours cutting a double-bed-size quilt! If you want to hand-cut the shapes, cut:

From each blue and yellow print: 1—6% square. cutting it in half diagonally for 2 large triangles total of each print (you'll have 1 leftover triangle of each print); 3—31/8" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 6 small triangles total of each print (you'll have 1 leftover triangle of each print)

Half Square-3" Finished Triangle Quilt Block E (55009) Use 5" × 10" Mat (55110)

Scraps of white, light pink, pink, and dark pink prints

cutfabries

From white print, cut: 8—Block E (3") triangles

From light pink print, cut: 8—Block E (3") triangles

From pink print, cut: 8—Block E (3") triangles

From dark pink print, cut: 4—Block B (3½") squares

assemble block

- 1. Sew together a white print triangle and a light pink print triangle to make a whiteand-light-pink triangle-square (Diagram 1). Press seam toward light pink print triangle. Repeat to make four white-and-light-pink triangle-squares. In the same manner, make four pink-and-light-pink triangle-squares and four white-and-pink triangle-squares.
- 2. Lay out triangle-squares and dark pink print squares (Diagram 2). Sew together to make two of Units A, B, C and D.
- 3. Sew together units in pairs (Diagram 3). Press seams toward Unit B. Then join pairs to make a block (Photo). Press seam open.



For scrappy quilts, layer several different fabrics together, then cut.



By using AccuQuilt® GO!™ you can save about 3 hours cutting a double-bed-size quilt! If you want to hand-cut the shapes, cut:

From each white print, light pink print and pink print: 4—31/8" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 8 triangles of each print (24 triangles total)

From dark pink print: 4—3½" squares

4-Block G (Parallelogram)

4—Block G reversed (Parallelogram)

From white print, cut:

4—Block F (4¾") squares

4—Block E (3") triangles

assemble block

Mark matching points (where seam lines intersect) on fabric. To set in seams, join angled pieces by aligning matching points. Start and stop sewing at points; backstitch. Do not sew into \(^1\lambda\)" seam allowances.

- 1. Pin together a print diamond and a print reversed diamond (Diagram 1), carefully aligning seam allowances and matching points. Sew together to make a diamond pair; finger-press seam toward darker print.
- **2.** Pin short edge of white print triangle to one short edge of diamond pair (Diagram 2). Sew from inner to outer corner. Pin remaining short edge of triangle to adjacent diamond. Stitch as before to make a star point unit. Press seams toward diamonds.
- 3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 to make four star point units total.
- 4. Join two star point units (Diagram 3). Set a white print square into corner to make a star half. Press seams toward diamonds. Repeat to make a second star half.
- 5. Join star halves (Diagram 4). Set squares into remaining corners to make a block (Photo). Press seams toward diamonds.

From assorted prints: 4 of Pattern A; 4 of Pattern A reversed

From white print: $1-5\frac{1}{2}$ " square, cutting it diagonally twice in an X for 4 triangles total; 4-43/4" squares






4—Isosceles triangles

From pink print, cut: 4—Isosceles triangles

From orange print, cut (placing 90° angle on straight of grain):

4—Block E (3") triangles

assemble block

- 1. Sew together a white print triangle and a pink print triangle to make a triangle pair (**Diagram 1**). Press seam toward pink print triangle. Repeat to make four pairs total.
- Join two pairs to make a half block unit (Diagram 2). Press seam toward pink print triangle. Repeat to make a second half block unit.
- **3.** Sew together half block units to make a center unit (**Diagram 3**). Press seam open.
- **4.** Referring to **Diagram 4**, add an orange print triangle to each pink print triangle to make a block **(Photo)**.



To conserve fabric, align fabric over blades only, not entire die surface.

assemble block


- 1. Lay out five green print 2½" squares and four blue print 21/2" squares in three horizontal rows (Diagram 1).
- 2. Sew together squares in each row. Press seams toward blue print squares. Then join rows to make a Nine-Patch unit (Diagram 2). Press seams in one direction. The Nine-Patch unit should be 6½" square including seam allowances.
- 3. Sew a blue print square to one end of a green print $2\frac{1}{2}$ " × $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to make a rectangle unit (Diagram 3). Press seam toward blue print square. Repeat to make four rectangle units total.
- 4. Place a rectangle unit along top edge of Nine-Patch unit. Sew together, stopping 1" from top left corner (Diagram 4). Press seam toward rectangle unit.
- 5. Sew a second rectangle unit to right-hand edge of Nine-Patch unit. Press seam toward rectangle unit. Then join a rectangle unit to bottom edge of Nine-Patch unit. Press seam toward rectangle unit.
- 6. Add remaining rectangle unit to left-hand edge of Nine-Patch unit (Diagram 5). Sew remaining portion of first rectangle unit in place to make a block (Photo).






From light pink print, cut: 1—(5") square

From orange print, cut: $2-2" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ strips (Strip Cutter-2")

From dark pink print, cut: $2-2" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ strips (Strip Cutter-2")

assemble block

- 1. Place an orange print $2" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ strip along bottom edge of light pink print 5" square. Sew together, stopping 1" from bottom left corner (Diagram 1). Press seam toward the orange strip.
- **2.** Sew a dark pink print $2'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ strip to right-hand edge of Step 1 unit. Press seam toward dark pink print strip. Then join remaining orange print $2" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ strip to top edge of unit (Diagram 2). Press seam toward orange print strip.
- **3.** Add remaining dark pink print $2'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ strip to left-hand edge of Step 2 unit (Diagram 3). Sew remaining portion of first orange print strip in place to make a block (Photo). Press all seams toward strips.




- 1. Sew together two white print triangles and two blue print triangles in pairs (Hourglass Diagram). Press seams open. Then join pairs to make an Hourglass unit. Press seam open. The Hourglass unit should be $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four Hourglass units total.
- 2. Sew together Hourglass units in pairs. Then join pairs to make a block (Photo). Press seams open.



For perfect halfsquare triangles, place layers of fabric on die right sides together, then cut.





From teal print, cut:

 $3-1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 12" strips (Strip Cutter- $1\frac{1}{2}$ ")

assemble block

- 1. Aligning long edges, sew together a yellow print, green print, and teal print strip to make a strip set (Diagram 1). Repeat to make three strip sets total.
- 2. Cut strip sets into nine 3½"-wide segments total (Diagram 2).
- 3. Lay out segments in three horizontal rows (Diagram 3). Sew together segments in each row. Press seams toward segments running vertically. Then join rows to make a block (Photo). Press seams in one direction.

From each yellow, green, and teal print: $3-1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 12" strips (9 strips total)

assemble block

- 1. Fold multicolor print 6½" square in half horizontally and vertically; lightly press. Center orange print hexagon appliqué on folded lines.
- 2. Place pink print hexagon appliqués around orange print hexagon (Appliqué Placement Diagram). Fuse all pieces in place.
- 3. Machine-blanket-stitch around edges of appliqués to make a block (Photo).



On die boards with multiple shapes, align fabric only over shapes you need.





assemble block

- 1. Position appliqué pieces A-D on white print 12½" square (Appliqué Placement Diagram). Fuse in place.
- 2. Machine-blanket-stitch edges of appliqués to make a block (Photo).




