


Assembly Instructions

Sew the equilateral triangles together in diagonal rows. Line up the notches and sew the seam. Alternate the orientation of the triangles as you add them to the row. The first triangle is point up. The second is point down. The third one is point up. The fourth is point down. (All odd triangles are point up and all even triangles are point down)



NOTE: The Row 7 & 8 pair is offset from Rows 5 & 6. The white triangle in Row 6 is the top point for the Star of David. Line up this white triangle with the middle white triangle in Row 7.


Rows 9, 10, 11, & 12 are identical to 5, 6, 7, & 8.

Sew Rows 1-4 to Rows 5-8.

Then sew Rows 9-12 to Rows 13 & 14.



Then sew the two halves together.



Add the Chanukah Menorahs (Chanukiah/Hanukkiyah) to the table runner.



NOTE: Things to know about the Chanukiah


- The Chanukiah has 9 branches a regular Menorah has 7.
- The Chanukiah has 1 candle for each night and the Shamash/Shammash (Helper) candle.
- The Shamash is positioned a little higher or lower than the other 8. So, on our table runner position the center lamp stand vertical piece where the top is either slightly higher or lower than the other 8 branches.
- The Shamash is lit every day. So, on our table runner the Shamash will be lit on all 8 Chanukiah.
- The Shamash is used to light the other candles.
- Each day another candle is added to the Chanukiah. The candles are added from right to left.
- The candles are lit from left to right.

There are 8 menorahs. Each menorah requires a full cut of the rainbow arcs.

Prefuse the gold fabric with fusible webbing and cut 8 rainbows.

For each Chanukiah you will need every other arc from the rainbow and 1 lamp stand.


Be sure to leave a piece of the gold for the lamp stands. **Leave a piece 5" X 10" unfused to use for the Menorahs lamp stands.**



Using the Applique Templates provided, trace 8 Chanukiah lamp stands onto the paper side of the fusible webbing. Also trace 44 flames and 44 flame centers onto the paper side of the fusible webbing. Following the manufacturer's instructions, press the fusible webbing with the drawn applique pieces to the reverse (wrong) side of the appropriate fabric. Then cut all the appliques along the drawn lines.

Press the flame centers onto the flames. Make 44.

Press the Chanukiah to the table runner. There are 8 Chanukiah, one for each day. Refer to layout here to place them.



Below are the diagrams for Chanukiah layout for each day:

NOTE: The table runner is quilted without a back.

Once all the Chanukiah and flames are fused in place, layer the top with the batting and quilt. I stitched in the ditch and stitched down the Chanukiah and flames.


Once the top has been quilted. Trim away the excess batting so it is the same size as the table runner top.

Sew the backing together.

Sew Piece 1 to Piece 2 using a 1/2" seam allowance.

Leave the space between the dots open (Unsewn).

Press the seam open.






Press the seam open.



Layer the quilted top onto the backing. Lay the top face down. Pin together to prevent shifting while sewing.


Sew the quilt top and back together using a 1/4" seam allowance. Sew all the way around the outside of the table runner.



Clip all the corners. Turn the table runner right side out through the whole in the backing. Use a point turner to push all the corners out properly. Press the table runner well.

Hand stitch the opening in the backing closed. Your table runner is now complete.





Red	GO! Half Square Triangle-1-1/2" Finished Square (Shape 5)	Cut 1—3" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Fanfold into 5-1/2" widths. Sub cut into 20—1-1/2" finished half square triangles.
Black	GO! Classic 2" Alphabet Uppercase (55559)	Cut letters for the words JOY, HOPE, and NOEL (apply fusible web to back of black fabric before cutting).
Lining Fabric	GO! Santa Stocking (55854)	Cut 3—12" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Sub cut into 6—stockings (foot only, not the cuff).

Sewing Directions:

Press all seams open and use 1/4" seams, unless otherwise indicated.


Assemble Square in a Square Stars

1. Sew two red 1-1/2" finished half square triangles (Shape 5) to one white 3" finished quarter square triangle (Shape 4). Press seams open. Finished white and red flying geese should measure 3-1/2" x 2". Repeat to make a total of four white and red flying geese units.
2. Sew two white 1-1/2" finished half square triangles (Shape 5) to one red 3" finished quarter square triangle (Shape 4). Press seams open. Finished red and white flying geese should measure 3-1/2" x 2". Repeat to make a total of eight red and white flying geese units.
3. Sew four red 1-1/2" finished half square triangles (Shape 5) to one white square on point (Shape 6). Press seams open. Square in a square should measure 3-1/2" x 3-1/2".
4. Sew one red and one white square in a square star block together as shown below using a square in a square block, four flying geese blocks, and four 2" squares for each star block. Press all seams open. The completed square in a square star blocks should measure 6-1/2" x 6-1/2".




Assemble Pinwheel Star


1. Sew one red 1-1/2" finished half square triangles (Shape 5) to a white triangle (Shape 5). Press seams open. The half square triangle unit should measure 2" x 2". Make a total of four half square triangles.



2. Place the four half square triangle units into a pinwheel formation as shown to the right. Assemble as shown, pressing all seams open. The pinwheel block should measure 3-1/2" x 3-1/2".




3. Sew the pinwheel star together as shown below, using four red and white flying geese units, four 2" red squares, and the pinwheel block. Press all seams open. The completed pinwheel star block should measure 6-1/2" x 6-1/2".




Assemble Stocking Fronts

1. From the red fabric, cut four 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares, two 6" x 18-1/2" strips, and two 3" x 18-1/2" strips.
2. From the white fabric, cut two 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares, one 6" x 18-1/2" strip, and one 3" x 18-1/2" strip.
3. Sew two four 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares, one 6" X 18-1/2" strip, and one 3" x 18-1/2" strip to one of the star blocks as shown below. Press all seams away from the star block.
4. Repeat with remaining two-star blocks to create three stocking front panels.




5. Baste each stocking panel to a piece of batting approximately 15" x 18". Quilt as desired.
6. Place the batting side down on the GO! Stockings die and carefully align the stocking panel so the star is centered between the edges of the stocking sides. Cut one stocking shape (foot only, not cuff) from quilted panel.




Assemble Stocking Backs

1. For the stocking backs, cut two pieces each 12" x 18" from the red fabric and one 12" x 18" piece from the white fabric. From the batting, cut three pieces each 12" x 18". Pair up each backing with a batting and smooth out the layers so they are straight and flat.
2. Place each of the backing/batting pairs backing side down (batting side up) on the GO! Stockings die one at a time and cut out a stocking shape (foot only, not cuff).
3. Place one of the red batting/backing pairs right sides together on top of one of the red stocking panels, lining up all of the raw edges. Start at the top corner and sew the layers together down the foot of the stocking using a 1/4" seam allowance. Leave the entire top edge open. Repeat with the remaining red panel and the white panel.



Assemble Stocking Lining

1. Place two cut lining pieces right sides together and sew down the foot of the stocking using a 1/4" seam allowance. Leave the top of the stocking open and leave the stocking as is (do not turn right sides out). Repeat with remaining lining pieces to yield three linings.
2. Slide each of the linings into one of the outer stocking units so the raw edges at the top are lined up. Sew a 1/8" seam around the raw edges to securely attach the lining to the outer stocking.



Assemble the Hang Tab



1. Cut a strip 2" x 20" from the white fabric. Fold in half the long way, press, then unfold to create a crease.
2. Fold the top edge down to the center crease, press into place.
3. Fold the bottom edge up to the center crease, press into place.
4. Fold the strip in half along the original center crease line and press again. Top stitch along the open edge.
5. Cut the strip into three 6" lengths.

Assemble the Cuff

1. Sew four cut white cuff pieces together. Press all seams open. Keep the wrong-side of the cuff facing up.
2. Cut a piece of batting 14-1/4" x 4-1/4". Place the batting on the bottom half of the wrong side of the cuff. Fold the right side of the batting/cuff combo around the back (right sides together) and align with the left side of the cuff. Sew the cuff and batting layers together down the left side of the unit using a 1/4" seam.
3. Roll the top edge of the cuff down around the batting to create a tube with the batting fully enclosed by the cuff.
4. Fold a white Hang Tab in half so it is 3" long. Place the raw edge of hang tag on the left seam of the cuff, aligning the raw edges. Sew the tag onto the cuff with a 1/8" seam.
5. Repeat steps 1-4 to create a total of two white cuffs and one red cuff.

Assemble the Stocking

1. Flip the cuff so the raw edges are facing up and slide into one of the prepared stockings so the raw edges of the cuff line up exactly with the raw edges of the stocking/lining. Check to make sure that the hang tag is hanging down into the stocking and didn't get folded up.
2. Sew around the entire perimeter of the stocking opening with a 1/4" seam. Make sure to catch the raw edges of all of the layers in the seam.
3. Flip the cuff up and out of the stocking opening and turn down to conceal the seam just sewn. The cuff can be turned down as much or as little as wanted to achieve the desired look.
4. Using the fusible web's manufacturer's instructions, attach the words "JOY," "HOPE," and "NOEL" to each of the cuffs.

Press all seams open and use ¼" seams, unless otherwise indicated.

Susannah Variation No. 2 Block

1. Sew a red half square triangle (HST) (Shape 5) onto opposite sides of a white square on point (Shape 6) as shown. Press seams open.



2. Sew a red HST (Shape 5) to the remaining two sides of the white square on point (Shape 6) as shown. Press seams open. This completes the center square in a square unit. Make a total of 18 square in a square units.




3. Complete center row assembly by stitching a white rectangle (Shape 8) to either side of the square in a square center unit as show. Press seams toward the rectangles.




4. Assemble top and bottom rows of block by sewing a red square (Shape 2) to either end of a white rectangle (Shape 8) as shown. Press seams toward the rectangle.

TIP: When pressing a dark shape seam toward a light shape, be sure that the edge of the dark shape does not show over the edge of the light shape. If it does, it can be trimmed with sharp embroidery scissors.



5. Complete block assembly by stitching the top and bottom rows to the center row of the block making sure seams nest in alternating directions as shown. Make a total of 18 blocks.




Holiday Medley Machine Embroidery Blocks

1. Cut background squares for machine embroidery 8" square. Squares will be cut down to 6½" square after machine embroidery is complete. Make 8 Snowflake Blocks, 8 Tree Blocks and 1 Holly Block.
2. Select embroidery designs for trees, snowflakes and holly using either GO! Holiday Medley Embroidery Designs by Marjorie Busby (BQ-HMe) **OR** GO! Holiday Medley Embroidery Designs CD by Marjorie Busby (MBME55043). *NOTE: The tree design with a star on top is too large for this quilt. All other designs will fit and designs can be interchanged as desired.*
3. Follow instructions in machine embroidery design set for completing machine embroidery.
4. When all embroidery designs are complete, center design on background square and trim quilt block to 6½".

Assemble the Quilt Top



1. Lay out blocks as shown.
2. Pin and sew blocks into rows, pressing seams in opposite directions.
3. Pin and sew rows together to make the quilt top.



Add Borders to Assembled Quilt Top


Red Border

1. Cut fabric for red borders using the GO! Strip Cutter-2½" (2" Finished) (55014 or 55017). Cut 4 to 5—2½" strips. If the width of fabric is less than 44", strips may be pieced either end to end or using a diagonal seam.
2. Measure vertically along both sides and vertically through the middle of the quilt top. The measurement should be 42½". If it is not, take all three measurements, average them and cut the 2½" strip the length of the average measurement.
3. Pin and stitch the vertical borders to the right and left sides of the quilt top, easing as necessary. Press seams toward the border.
4. Measure horizontally along the top and bottom and the middle of the quilt top. The measurement should be 34½". If it is not, average the three measurements and cut the 2½" strip the length of the average measurement.
5. Pin and stitch the horizontal borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top, easing as necessary. Press seams toward the border.



Green Border

1. Cut fabric for green borders using the GO! Strip Cutter-3½" (3" Finished) (55032). Cut 5—3½" strips. Strips may be pieced either end to end or using a diagonal seam to make a continuous strip.
2. Measure vertically along both sides and vertically through the middle of the quilt top. The measurement should be 46½". If it is not, take all three measurements, average them and cut the 3½" strip the length of the average measurement.
3. Pin and stitch the vertical borders to the right and left sides of the quilt top, easing as necessary. Press seams toward the border. Press seams toward the border.
4. Measure horizontally along the top and bottom and the middle of the quilt top. The measurement should be 40½". If it is not, average the three measurements and cut the 3½" strip the length of the average measurement.
5. Pin and stitch the horizontal borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top, easing as necessary. Press seams toward the border.




Quilting and Finishing

1. Layer quilt top with batting and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Model was custom machine quilted.
4. Attach bias binding, mitering the corners.





Pink	GO! Irish Chain 10" Finished (55649)	Cut 2- 5" x WOF strips. Sub cut strips into 64- 2-3/4" x 5" rectangles. Place six rectangles at a time over both shape B. Total of 64 shape B pieces.
Red	GO! Irish Chain 10" Finished (55649)	Cut 3- 5" strips off the fat quarter on the 18" side. Fan fold each strip six times over both shape B. Total of 36 shape B pieces.

3. Pin or baste layers together.
4. Quilt as desired.
5. Add Bear Lake Sparkler binding, mitering the corners.



Sewing Directions:

Stocking

1. Follow the directions for the June Tailor Holiday Stocking stopping after you have pieced both stockings and cut the stocking shapes close to the original outside stitching lines.
2. Place Puppy Body shape 6" down from the top edge of the stocking (see diagram).



3. Place additional Puppy parts on the body as desired. Add a bone or bow if desired. Fuse the shapes according to manufacturer's directions.
4. Stitch applique as desired.
5. Return to Holiday Stocking pattern and continue until stocking is complete.

Tree Skirt

1. Follow the directions for the June Tailor Tree Skirt stopping after you trim just to the outside of the stitching line of the outer and inner circle as well as on the stitched line between 1 and 16.
2. Place Puppy Body 2-1/4" up from the bottom of every other wedge. (see diagram)



3. Place additional Puppy parts on the body as desired. Add a bone or bow if desired. Fuse the shapes according to manufacturer's directions. (See diagrams for Puppy inspiration).



4. Stitch appliques as desired.
5. Return to the Tree skirt pattern and continue until skirt is complete.
