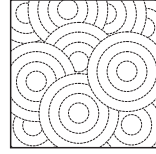
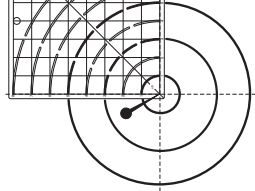
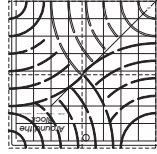
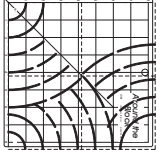
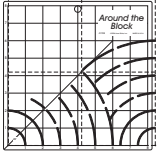
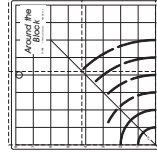
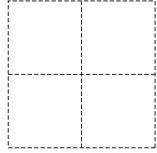


To mark a block in curved quarters:

- Mark a cross section on block.
- Place ruler on corner of block aligning a central point of a curve with the center of the marked cross section. Mark curves to corner of block.
- Rotate ruler. Align and mark as in previous step.
- Repeat two more times to complete marking block.

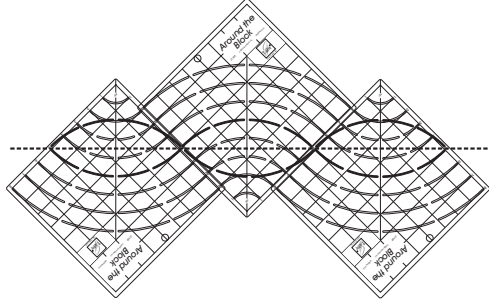
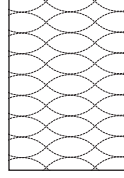
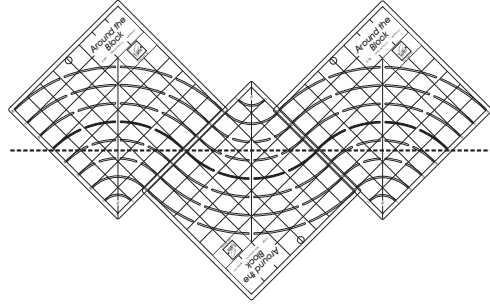
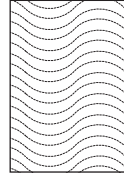


To mark concentric circles:

- Mark a cross section on quilt.
- Align corner of ruler with markings and mark in lines.
- Rotate ruler and mark in all four quadrants of cross section.

OR

- Place pin in pinhole of ruler to anchor ruler to fabric.
- Mark circles while rotating ruler.



To mark a repetitive wave pattern:

- Draw straight lines on quilt at desired increments.
- Align end points of ruler on straight line and mark curve.
- Rotate ruler 180° and align end points on straight line, connecting to end of last mark.
- Continue down length of line and repeat process for consecutively marked straight lines.

To mark a chain pattern:

- Draw straight line on quilt.
- Using instructions for the repetitive wave pattern, mark down length of straight line.
- Flip ruler and mark the same pattern on the opposite side of the straight line.
- Mark additional straight lines spacing at distances equal to the widest point of the chain.
- Continue marking pattern in the same manner.
